## Planning Matters update – the Local Plan

Over the past few years your Parish has been making the strongest representations to the East Riding to reduce the proposed housing allocation of 85 dwellings in the village and latterly the allocation of the two fields between The Stray, Little Wold Lane, Middlegarth Drive and Station Road for housing. With other small applications this could mean this figure doubling over the next plan period to 2026. ERYC have rejected our objections and we are now in the final phase of “consultation” which means we can only now object on the legality or soundness of the plan. The final plan is on the ERYC website and usual sources. The Parish has identified a number of processes which it believes are wrong, but these are quite technical and complex issues.

If the Parish objects and wins its case at a Public Inquiry then the whole plan would fall and the East Riding Council would have to start again; more individual applications for houses are then likely in the interim and we would have to deal with these without a set plan or allocation to rely on. There is also no guarantee that ERYC, in revisiting the Local Plan would change our allocation (and that could be less or more). Of course we may not win at all (or others might). This is quite a large undertaking and we need professional advice as to whether we have sufficient grounds to object and this will need fund raising to represent our views properly. While there is clearly a point of principle around over-development, there are risks and we recognise there are the pragmatic issues to consider as well. Before going further, we would like to initially canvass your views as to whether you would like us to continue to object on your behalf or not.

## **EAST YORKSHIRE FEDERATION WOMEN'S INSTITUTE MEMBERS GET THE CENTENARY PARTY STARTED**

Centenary celebrations begin on Thursday, 15 May for WI Members nationwide as the specially designed Centenary Baton officially starts its journey around the East Yorkshire Federation which comprises over 50 WIs.

The baton, launched on 1 January 2014 in Anglesey, where the first WI meeting was held in the UK in 1915, is travelling across the 69 WI Federations in England, Wales and the Islands throughout the year in celebration of the links of friendship and community developed through the WI. It will finish its trip at the WI's Centenary Annual Meeting in June 2015 at the Royal Albert Hall in London.

The baton will travel the length and breadth of the UK to visit every Federation, and will form the start of the WI's centenary celebrations as each Federation plans a celebratory event to involve as many WI members as possible in the biggest ever WI party.

Each Federation will also upload twelve selected photos to a memory stick stored within the baton to represent their members, WIs and the local area. The photos will be shared on social media to keep everyone in touch and so that members across the country can share in the party as the baton makes its journey.

Margaret Kirby, Chairman of the East Yorkshire Federation said:-

"It's so exciting to be a part of the first centenary project to celebrate 100 years of the WI. We hope to involve as many members as possible to celebrate WI membership and everything that it offers; the chance to learn

new skills, campaign on issues that are important to us at every level, and make life-long friends.

Celebrating the centenary with fellow members across the nation really highlights the role that all members have played in bringing their communities together since the very beginning of the WI, and we can't wait to follow the baton's trip once it has left us and travelled on around the Federations."

Whilst in East Yorkshire, the baton celebration will be at Howden Ashes Playing Field on Thursday afternoon 15 May and will comprise nine local WIs, including South Cave. More details will be announced nearer the date.

South Cave WI will be holding their own party the morning of Thursday, 15 May, in the WI Hall in Church Street, before moving on to the Howden Ashes in the afternoon. It is planned to invite representatives from other organisations within the village to the celebration.

## Christmas Lights Switch on – Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> November 2013


Thank you for your support in the Christmas Lights switch on event, which was a huge success again.

## South Cave during World War I

### *How the War affected the village and its families*

2014 marks one hundred years since the start of World War I. Around the country and in the media many events and programmes are being planned to commemorate those years.

The Caves U3A Local History Group has started to research into life in South Cave during the period, including those who served in the Forces and how the villagers contributed to the war effort. Many of the servicemen (but not all) are commemorated on the Roll of Honour (outside the Town Hall) and, sadly, some are listed on the War Memorial (at West End, near the entrance to Cave Castle). We plan to produce a small display (in both the Town Hall and the Library) to highlight aspects of the war as it affected South Cave. The text and illustrations will be changed fairly frequently and will mark anniversaries of events and local personalities (both military and civilian).

We would like to know of others who may be involved in similar projects and would be happy to collaborate with them if appropriate.

The first display is due to be put up at the beginning of August, to mark 4<sup>th</sup> August, when Britain declared war on Germany.

## **Support Your Local Farmers' Market!**

How often do we complain about overpackaged supermarket foods, about fruit and vegetables shipped in from far-flung places? Yet we continue to be seduced by the convenience of supermarket shopping and the ease of online deliveries. Attendance at farmers' markets has declined considerably since they first appeared on the scene fifteen years ago: people live busier lives and the recession continues to bite, making those two-for-one offers seem more attractive (even if the second item often ends up in the bin!).

Unfortunately the South Cave Farmers' Market (which takes place at the school on the second Saturday morning of each month) is no exception. Since it started in 2001, the numbers attending have gradually diminished, reducing the returns to the traders who have been faithful to the market since the beginning. But the quality of what is on offer remains the same, as regular attendees – undeterred by weather or rival attractions – will testify. You will always find meat, eggs and vegetables from local farms; freshly baked pies, bread and cakes; jams and preserves; fresh crab and cut flowers make an appearance at certain times of the year. In recent years the market has expanded to include local crafts, a range of goods from floral chocolates to aromatherapy products. And when you have finished your shopping you can enjoy a cup of coffee and a bacon butty as well.

But there is more to the market than this. At Christmas Santa Claus made an appearance on his motorbike, and this year there are plans for an Easter extravaganza including children's activities. The market is a focal point for our community, a place to greet friends and acquaintances and to meet local traders. The charity stall raises much needed funds for local groups, and amid the food and crafts at the January market was a stall campaigning to save our local post office, a cause of great importance to the village.

We need you to help us keep the farmers' market alive, to remember that the supermarket is not the only choice for food shopping. Please consider taking a few moments out of your busy schedule to visit the farmers' market: support your local traders, reconnect with the community, and enjoy some fresh seasonal food at the same time.
