VE DAY 2020. SOUTH CAVE

May 8th was a glorious sunny day, the Nation as a whole united in remembering the end of a terrible war and the beginning of peace time.

Our village prepared in advance for what was to turn out to be a memorable day. In the days leading up to it the village was slowly being transformed into red, white and blue.

The Royal British Legion use the poppy as their symbol as a show of support for the Armed Forces Community whatever war that has been fought since WW1, when the poppy was first used hence Church Street had large Poppies on the lampposts all the way to the Castle. The Union flag was flown on the Town Hall and many houses also flew the nations' flag. Bunting was adorned all over the village, houses, hedges, the school railings and many other places.

During the day a plaque was dedicated at the war memorial and a wreath laid on behalf of the village by the Chair of South Cave Parish Council, this was heralded by a lone trumpet player and two minutes silence was held as we remembered those who gave the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom.



The world is fighting another “war” at the moment and a day of remembering the welcoming of peace was carried out in full in our village as we had a most welcome respite from “lockdown”

As the afternoon progressed people sat in their gardens, driveways and roads(all observing the social distancing) and had afternoon tea, drinks, food. Some people organised games, quizzes and anything that made it a memorable day, this was adults and children alike.. We even had a slot on Radio Humberside, who acknowledged that our village was Red, White and Blue and had a wonderful community atmosphere. Many people dressed in red, white and blue and some even wore appropriate costumes.

As late afternoon turned to evening, there were two street singers, one in Water Lane and one in the Market Place where a party was held along its length. The sound of singing could be heard as people remembered how hostilities ended and the nation sang then 75 years ago.

The sense of Community was really shown and felt and what was a day of remembrance turned out to be a day for us in South Cave to remember.

Ken Noble A well know South Cave farmer and business man passed away on 5th May 2020. Ken had been a South Cave Parish Councillor for a number of years. He also was a Trustee of the Sophia Barnard Allotment Charity for 40years. His advice on farming matters was invaluable and he will be sorely missed by the committee. East Riding of Yorkshire Council – Dog Fouling

We are keen to catch the people who fail to clean up after their pets, but need the help of residents to do so.

This takes the form of local residents giving us what information they have about the culprits. This is taken in confidence so the perpetrators will not be aware of who gave us information about them.

We ask for details such as the usual time a particular culprit will walk their dog(s) and what they look like, or sometimes we are given the address of a perpetrator and can write to them in the first instance. We have stopped doing random patrols in the hope of catching the culprits, as this does not work.

We now ask for more detailed information so as to better target our resources and hopefully catch people in the act, or at least write to them to challenge their behaviour.

Dear Resident

We are writing to you with regards to how you can access support and safeguard yourself against scams during the coronavirus outbreak.

Unfortunately, not everyone out there is trustworthy and some people will try to take advantage of this unusual situation our society is facing and try to exploit people.

Listed below are some of the scams that you could be approached with, but please note that criminals and their scams come in all shapes and sizes, and they may contact you at the door, by phone, post or online:

- Be aware of people offering miracle cures or vaccines for coronavirus – there is no specific treatment for coronavirus (COVID-19)
- People impersonating healthcare workers, claiming to be offering 'home-testing' for coronavirus – this is a scam and these kits are not currently available to buy
- Emails saying that you can get a refund on taxes, utilities or similar - they are usually bogus and they are just trying to obtain your bank and personal details
- Fake products available to buy online that advise they can protect you or cure coronavirus - these will not help and are just designed to take your money
- Mobile phone applications that claim to give you updates on the virus but instead, they lock your phone and demand a ransom
- Calls from people purporting to be from your bank, or from the police, asking for your bank details over the phone

- People offering to do your shopping or collecting medication and asking for money upfront and then disappearing

To avoid becoming a victim of a scam, please follow our tips and advice below:

- Be cautious and listen to your instincts. Don't be afraid to hang up, bin it, delete it or shut the door
- Take your time; don't be rushed
- If someone claims to represent a charity, ask them for ID. Be suspicious of requests for money up front. Check with family and friends before accepting offers of help if you are unsure
- If you are online, be aware of fake news and use trusted sources such as .gov.uk or NHS.uk websites. Make sure you type the addresses in and don't click on links in emails
- Only purchase goods from legitimate retailers and take a moment to think before parting with money or personal information
- Know who you're dealing with - if you need help, talk to someone you know or get in touch with your local Council on the numbers below
- Protect your financial information, especially from people you do not know. Never give your bank card or PIN to a stranger

We know it can be difficult to know who to trust, and we hope this information helps you to feel more informed and more able to protect yourself against these types of scams.

If you are online or have a mobile phone Facebook Community groups and WhatsApp groups can be great ways of staying in touch with those around you.



You can also sign up to Humberside Police's My Community Alert at www.mycommuntiyalert.co.uk to receive updates straight to your mobile or email on what is going on in your community.

Public Rights of Way

Public Rights of Way provide rights of access for the public to travel over private land and include footpaths, bridleways and byways both in rural and urban areas.

Ordnance Survey maps are useful but they are not always up to date and you should check your planned route is shown on the Definitive Map (legal record) if at all unsure. You can view the East Riding of Yorkshire's definitive map and use it to plan a route on the *Walking the Riding* page of www.eastridingcoastandcountryside.co.uk. You will also find 100's of suggested routes already listed and information about other ways to access the countryside. You can contact us at countryside.access@eastriding.gov.uk

There are four main types of public right of way (footpaths being the most common) and which ones you are permitted to use will depend on whether you are walking, cycling, riding or using a motor vehicle. Here is a helpful guide.



Public Footpath (yellow arrows)
Walkers only



Byway (red arrows)
Walkers, cyclists, horse riders,
carriage drivers & motor vehicles



Public Bridleway (blue arrows)
Walkers, cyclists & horse riders
only



Restricted Byway (plum arrows)
Walkers, cyclists, horse riders &
carriage drivers only

Please do not cycle on public footpaths as this can result in; civil trespass, surface damage, conflict with other users or landowners and could pose a hazard to other users.

Always respect the rights and livelihoods of the landowners whose land you may pass through and keep to the public right of way. You can find helpful advice about using public rights of way and how to behave responsibly in the countryside on the Ramblers webpage and in the Countryside Code. www.ramblers.org.uk
