The Clerk delivers the decisions made by the Parish Council and has no vote within the decision-making process.**

## **DOG FOULING.**

Once again, the Parish Council has received several more complaints regarding dog fouling. Most dog owners/walkers in South Cave behave responsibly and give regard and respect to all of us, but unfortunately there are a few who make our pavements unpleasant places to walk and spoil our lovely village. We are fortunate in having a generous number of bins and whilst the dogs are not at fault, **IT IS AN OFFENCE** to allow your dog to foul in a public area.

## **PROWS – Public Rights of Ways**

East Riding of Yorkshire Council are responsible for the management of all recorded public rights of way within the South Cave Parish Boundary, and are responsible for:

- Signposting rights of way where they leave the road
- Waymarking paths along their route where necessary
- Keeping rights of way in reasonable repair and clearing surface vegetation
- Ensuring that they are free from obstructions
- Ensuring that farmers and landowners reinstate rights of way after ploughing or cropping
- Helping farmers and landowners to maintain gates in good condition
- Maintaining the definitive map and statement, which is the legal record of public rights of way
- Consideration of applications for the legal diversion of public rights of way
- Considering applications to modify the definitive map.

Landowners and farmers are responsible for:

- keeping all paths free from obstruction
- Cutting back overhanging vegetation
- Reinstatement of paths after ploughing and keeping them clear of growing crops
- Maintaining gates and stiles
- Not ploughing paths that run along a field edge.

It is normal to find undulations, uneven ground, and holes in the surface of these natural paths, and users should take care and follow the countryside code. ## Watercourse Responsibility

Updated national guidance for the responsibilities as a riparian owner has been published on the Government website by the Environment Agency.

If you or your business owns land or property through which a river, stream, or watercourse (including culverts passes) you are a riparian owner. Furthermore, where a watercourse forms a boundary with your property it is likely that you as the adjacent landowner, have riparian responsibilities up to the centre line of the watercourse (unless compelling evidence such as property deeds suggest otherwise)

Riparian owners have an important part to play in the East Riding and the council encourages its residents, businesses, and landowners, to consider the guidance available and ensure they are aware of their responsibilities as riparian owners if applicable. The guidance includes information on permits or consents you may need if carrying out works on or near a watercourse. By following the guidance, you can not only help to reduce the risk of flooding but also play a part in preventing pollution and protecting wildlife.

If you are unsure if you are a riparian owner, check the deeds to the property or contact the landlord.

## Preventing blockages - Yorkshire Water

### **How to prevent blocked drains and pipes in your home. Stop it. Don't block it.**

If you flush wipes and other sanitary items like cotton buds down your loo, or wash leftover cooking fat, oil and grease down your sink, you could cause a blockage in your pipes.

With nowhere else to go, your wastewater could end up pouring back up and out into your kitchen or bathroom. And nobody wants that!

### **Our do's and don'ts**

Simple precautions will show you how to prevent blocked drains and pipes, which could cause wastewater to back-up and overflow, causing serious damage to your home.

### **Don't wash away leftover fat, oil and greasy sauces down your sink**

It can solidify in your pipes like a block of lard, creating a blockage that stops wastewater draining away, meaning it could come back up through your plug hole.

### **Don't flush wipes down the toilet**

Toilets are only designed to remove human waste and toilet roll. Other items like sanitary products, condoms, cotton buds, nappies and hair can block your pipes and could result in a flooded bathroom.

### **Bin and wipe before you rinse**

Let leftover fat, oil and grease cool, then pour into a suitable container and put it in the bin. Wipe pots and pans out with kitchen roll before washing up, or placing in a dishwasher. Sink strainers are a great idea for catching stray greasy food scraps too.

### **Put it in the bin!**

Wipes of all kinds can block pipes. Even if it says 'flushable' on the packet it's still a good idea to put them in the bin. Also make sure you put cotton buds, sanitary products, nappies, and condoms in bags and into the bin, not down the loo!
