(4)The Parish council noted and considered response to NPPF consultation. Cllr Edmond proposed the Parish Council submit their support for ERYC response to the NPPF indicating the current plan is sound with evidence the plan should be reevaluated, In summary, the government proposed to reverse the changes contained within the previous version of the NPPF published in December 2023 and to introduce new measures intended to boost the supply of housing and allow a more permissive approach towards new development in the Green Belt. Seconded Cllr Stephenson, All in favour

(5)The Parish Council received response relating to Bellway Homes – Salt Bin Installation & Considered adoption. Cllr Edmond proposed providing the bin was supplied by Bellway and installation arranged with ERYC, the annual maintenance costs to be fulfilled by the Parish Council to incorporate within the annual Salt Bin Maintenance plan and adoption to be considered if required.
