- The planters were acknowledged for their attractive appearance.
- Concerns were raised regarding parking issues during the recent football tournament. Stewards were present in the surrounding streets to manage the situation.

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Ward Councillors Report to Meeting for information

Cllrs C. Gill and T Gill were unavailable for the meeting but submitted the following written report:

EYRC Highways budget increases from £16 million to £22 million but won't touch the sides of the 20 year, £700 million back log of road the footpath repairs.

I draw your attention to the Environment & Regeneration OS Committee document attached for the full picture, from PAGE 11. This documents also contains the current budgetary challenges around roads and grounds maintenance.

So you will see why much of what is desperately needed for the Council to be more pro-active in repairing or renewing our Highways, is not going to happen anytime soon.

Brick wall boundary on land West of Station Road.

As we all know this has been a bone of contention for several years.

I have made further investigations as to who the current owners are. My findings are that the land is Registered under a Mr. SC Whitewalls of Beverley. However, this person is a Director of a company called GCH Holdings, of which has gone into liquidation. I am awaiting for 100% clarification form the liquidator whether the land is tied with GCH or the said person.

Additional Parking at Brough Station.

We have been creating more awareness of the additional parking at Brough Station, of which as been well received on the South Cave Residents' Facebook page. The new car park on Skillings Lane, Brough, just South of the level crossing. There are 54 spaces including EV and disabled ones.

Tariff's are similar to the on-station car parks: £5.80 per day, £26.80 per week Mon-Fri, £3 on Saturdays and FREE on Sundays. Paying is only via Downloading the APCOA App to your mobile device. Disabled parking, whist there are spaces is also chargeable at the same rates.

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We are hoping this car park will alleviate some of the inconsiderate parking in some of our Brough streets for those who are willing to pay for convenient and safer parking. There will be a residents Parking Permit survey going to be carried out soon and if over 80% agree it will be implemented. This should make the new car park even more viable.

- ② Cllr Meredith Brough Car Park: It was reported that the matter has been referred to the Review Panel at ERYC, including consideration of ERYC's car parking policies. It was clarified that the land in question is owned by the train station owner, not ERYC.
- ☑ **Highways:** A dedicated meeting will be held to review highways budgets. A recommendation was made to revise the 2027 budget to reflect the prioritisation of highways.
- ☑ St Katherine's Council Accommodation: It was noted that there are currently no dropped kerbs at the site. A request will be made for the installation of a dropped kerb.
- ☑ **TROD Station Road:** It was noted that grant funding may be available for this project; however, the Parish Council would be responsible for the ongoing maintenance of the trod/footpath.
- New Chief Executive Appointment: Paul Belotti has been appointed as the new Chief Executive. Alan Menzies is currently serving as the Interim Executive.

- All tree surgery should be in accordance with BS3998 (2010) to ensure that all works are carried out in an arboriculturally acceptable manner.
- Climbing spikes should not be used whilst undertaking any form of works on living trees to ensure undue, extensive, and long-term damage is not inflicted upon protected trees.
- To maintain the character and appearance of the Conservation Area the Parish Council should request ERYC to encourage and recommend where possible the planting of a suitable replacement tree(s) following the removal of existing trees.

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• If applicable, a BS5837 Tree Survey and Report is an essential process for anyone planning construction or development where trees are present either within or adjacent to your property.
